Crisis Responder Policy

Submissions Policy

The Australian Crisis Simulation Summit's (ACSS) *Crisis Responder* welcomes submissions of up to 1000 words of considered analysis related to Australia's national security discourse and/or foreign policy.

ACSS will accept longer pieces but may, in consultation with the author, publish them serially or in part.

All material submitted to the *Crisis Responder* should be original, and the author(s) agree to transfer the intellectual property rights to ACSS for the article in question.

In some instances ACSS may publish the Submitted Work elsewhere, but will do so with full attribution of the author(s) and noting the *Crisis Responder* as the original source.

In addition, you agree, in respect of any part of the Submitted Work in which you do not own copyright, to reasonably assist ACSS to obtain permission from the owner of the copyright to use that part of the Submitted Work.

Authors must disclose any commercial relationships, affiliations or conflicts of interest.

Anonymity

As a general rule the ACSS will not accept submissions from authors who wish to remain anonymous.

Editorial policy

The editors of the *Crisis Responder* reserve the right to edit the Submitted Work.

In the event that any Submitted Work is edited for reasons of style or brevity or other reason, the author(s) will be provided with the edited form for comment or further discussion at which stage the author can opt to withdraw the article.

The editors of the *Crisis Responder* will reject any Submitted Work that:

1. does not further discussions on Australia's national security discourse and/or foreign policy;
2. constitutes plagiarism;
3. which contravenes Australian defamation or vilification laws; or

4. in the judgement of the editorial staff of the *Crisis Responder*, for any other reason if the content is deemed inappropriate for publishing or is in poor taste.

Comments Policy

Crisis Responder encourages responses to posts, either in the form of short remarks, or in the form of additional blog posts of our standard length, which will be subject to the same conditions for submissions as outlined above.

Readers will not be able to post their Responses directly on the *Crisis Responder*. All comments will be directed to the editors, and will be considered for publication subject to the same editorial quality control mechanisms as the longer posts.

If the editors of the *Crisis Responder* edit the Responses, wherever possible, the author(s) of the Response will be provided with the edited form in advance of publication. Please note that the turn-around time may be less than twenty-four hours.

Readers must disclose any commercial relationships, affiliations or conflicts of interest.

User Warranties

Authors warrant that any and all submissions (whether in the form of Submitted Works or Responses) have been prepared with due care and diligence.

Authors agree to indemnify and hold ACSS harmless against any and all liability, loss claim, judgement or damage.

This indemnity includes, but is not limited to an indemnity against all actions, claims and demands (including the cost of defending or settling any actions, claim or demand) which may be instituted against us, as well as all expenses, penalties or fines (including those imposed by any regulatory body or under statute).

Cross-post and re-use policy

Crisis Responder uses a Creative Commons license.

Material published, copied, distributed or transmitted on the *Crisis Responder* is done so under license from Creative Commons pursuant to the [Creative Commons Unported License](#).



This license allows all articles and comments posted on the website to be copied, transmitted or redistributed without any further permission sought providing that:

1. The redistribution is for non-commercial purposes;

2. The original author of the work is credited;
3. *Crisis Responder* is credited as the original source, and a link is included to the original instance of the work on *Crisis Responder*; and
4. The work is not altered, only copied or redistributed.

The Creative Commons license only applies to original material posted on the *Crisis Responder* and does not cover material that the *Crisis Responder* has cross posted from another source with their permission.
